

### 3.1 Vocabulary

- ✓ Word store 3C-to learn the phrasal verbs about travel
- ✓ Check-in desk- one of the places at an airport where you show your ticket so that you can be told where you will be sitting
- ✓ Boarding pass-a card that a passenger must have in order to be allowed to get on an aircraft or a ship
- ✓ Departure lounge-the area in an airport where passengers wait before getting onto an aircraft
- ✓ Overhead locker-a locker situated above someone's seat for storing luggage
- ✓ Baggage reclaim-the place in an airport where you get your cases and bags when you arrive after flying
- ✓ Cargo ship-the goods carried by a ship, aircraft, or other large vehicle
- ✓ Sights - interesting places that people go to see
- ✓ Double-decker - a bus with two levels
- ✓ Traffic jam - a long line of vehicles on a road that cannot move or can only move very slowly

### 3.2 Lion on the loose in Essex

- ✚ Holidaymaker-a person who is on holiday away from where they usually live
- ✚ On the loose- if a dangerous person or animal is on the loose, that person or animal is free to move around a place and harm people

- City break-a short holiday spent in a city
- Overland tour- across the land in a vehicle, on foot, or on a horse; not by sea or air
- Youth hostel-a place where people, especially young people, can stay cheaply for short periods when they are travelling

- Put up with-to accept or continue to accept an unpleasant situation or experience, or someone who behaves unpleasantly
- Dense-having parts that are close together so that it is difficult to go or see through, e.g. dense forest, dense fog; abundant; thick
- Steep-(of a slope) rising or falling at a sharp angle
- Cascade-to fall quickly and in large amounts
- Look through-to read something quickly
- Overlooking-to provide a view of, especially from above
- Set off-to start on a trip
- Gaze-to look at something or someone for a long time, especially in surprise or admiration, or because you are thinking about something else
- Safari-an organized journey to look at, or sometimes hunt, wild animals, especially in Africa
- Unspoilt-an unspoiled place is beautiful because it has not been changed or damaged by people
- Gentle-not steep or sudden
- Globetrotter-someone who often travels to a lot of different countries
- Lively- - enthusiastic and cheerful
- Spoil - prevent from being successful or satisfactory
- Stunning - extremely beautiful or impressive
